BILLS INTRODUCED IN THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TAMIL NADU

Under Rule 130 of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly introduced Rules, the following Bill which was the State in the Legislative Assembly of of Tamil Nadu on 28th August, 2021 is published together with Statement of Objects and Reasons for general information:-

L.A. Bill No. 23 of 2021

A Bill to repeal the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2019.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu in the Seventy-second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Short title Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and Facilitation) Repeal Act, 2021.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2019 (Tamil Nadu Act 37 of 2019) which was enacted to provide for improved production and marketing of agricultural produce, livestock and its products through contract farming, is yet to be brought into force. Contract Farming is one among the marketing approaches, wherein the farmer and purchaser mutually agree upon the price, quantity, quality and time. The Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce Marketing (Regulation) Act, 1987 (Tamil Nadu Act 27 of 1989) provides for regulation of buying and selling of agricultural produce in this State. The agricultural marketing system now provides a better price discovery to the farmers. It is therefore considered that it would be appropriate to make the said Tamil Nadu Act 27 of 1989 more robust by providing regulation of buying and selling of agricultural produce under any mode of marketing, instead of bringing in an enactment for each mode of the marketing system. The Government have, therefore, decided to repeal the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2019 (Tamil Nadu Act 37 of 2019).

2. The Bill seeks to give effect to the above decision.

L.A. Bill No. 24 of 2021

A Bill further to amend the Tamil Nadu Clinical Establishments (Regulation) Act, 1997.

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu in the Seventy-second year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. (1) This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Clinical Establishments Short title and (Regulation) Amendment Act, 2021. commencement.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

Tamil Nadu Act 4 of 1997.

2. In section 2-D of the Tamil Nadu Clinical Establishments (Regulation) Amendment of Act, 1997, in sub-section (2), after clause (a), the following clause shall be, section 2-D inserted, namely:-

"(aa) The Deputy Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in the District".

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Section 2-D of the Tamil Nadu Clinical Establishments (Regulation) Act, 1997 (Tamil Nadu Act 4 of 1997) provides for the constitution of a District Committee in each District under Chairmanship of the Deputy Director of Medical and Rural Health Services to advise the competent authority of the district in the matters of registration of clinical establishments and to perform other duties connected therewith. The Deputy Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine in the district serves as the administrative head of all the Government primary health care facilities and are performing various technical and administrative functions relating to Public Health. The Government have, therefore, decided to include the Deputy Director of Public Health and Preventive I also a member of the District Committee. Accordingly, the Government have decided to amend the said Act.

2. The Bill seeks to give effect to the above decision.
