DRAFT AMENDMENT TO THE TAMIL NADU MOTOR VEHICLES RULES, 1989.

The following draft amendment to the Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, which is proposed to be made in exercise of the powers conferred by section 107 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988), is hereby published for the information of all persons, as required by sub-section (1) of section 212 of the said Act.

2. Notice is hereby given that the draft amendment will be taken into consideration on or after the expiry of ten days from the date of publication of this Notification in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette* Extraordinary and that any objection or suggestion, which may be received from any person with respect thereto before the expiry of the aforesaid period will be considered by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

3. Objection or suggestion, if any, should be addressed in duplicate to the Additional Chief Secretary to Government, Home, Prohibition and Excise Department, Secretariat, Chennai-600 009.

DRAFT AMENDMENT.

In the said Rules, in rule 230, in sub-rule (1), for clauses (ii), (iii) and the first *proviso* thereunder, the following shall be substituted, namely:-

“(ii) a child above five but not more than twelve years of age shall be reckoned as one half and one half of the full fare charged;

(iii) a child of not more than five years of age, shall not be reckoned and no fare shall be charged:

Provided that a child above five years of age, may be charged full fare in stage carriages operating as city or metropolitan services”.)
