

EXPLANATIONS:---(1) Dearness allowance: The employees shall be paid dearness allowance in addition to the minimum rates of basic wages fixed above as indicated below:-

- (i) Wages fixed therein are linked to the Average Chennai City Consumer Price index for the year 2000, 475 points (with base 1982=100) and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points, an increase of Rs.4.55 (Rupees four and paise fifty five only) per point per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.
- (ii) The dearness allowance shall be calculated every year on the 1st April on the basis of the average of the indices for the preceeding twelve months, that is, January to December.
- (iii) The first calculation shall thus be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette based on the average Index of the previous year.

(2) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made as between men and women employees.

(3) To arrive at daily rates of wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.

(4) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
