No. SRO B-32/2023.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby cancels the Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare Department Notifications Nos. SRO B-22/2015 and B-23/2015 published at Page 34 of Part III—Section 1(b) of the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*, dated the 18th March 2015.

No. SRO B-33/2023.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendment to the Special Rules for the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes Welfare Service.

2. The amendment hereby made shall be deemed to have come into force on and from the 5th August, 1993.

"SECTION 54 THE TAMIL NADU BACKWARD CLASSES AND MOST BACKWARD CLASSES WELFARE SERVICE".

Amendment to the Special Rules for the Tamil Nadu Forest Subordinate Service.

No. SRO B-34/2023.— In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendment to the Special Rules for the Tamil Nadu Forest Subordinate Service (Section-12 of Part III-B in Volume III of the Tamil Nadu Services Manual, 2016.)

AMENDMENT

In the said Special Rules, after rule 8-A, the following proviso shall be added, namely:-

"Provided that in the event of directly recruited Forest Apprentices belonging to the same batch year being trained from different institutions, the following methodology shall be employed for fixation of inter-se-seniority among the direct recruitment Forest Apprentices.-

Methodology.—

In simple normalization process, the total marks of any candidates from one College, is compared to the topper from the same College. The relative percentage of marks is derived for all the candidates for each of the College. Then, they are merged to form a single list of Ranks based on the marks / rank. In the case of Toppers, both the toppers from two Colleges will be ranked at same position (No.1 and No.2, the Topper will be decided by his / her date of birth, i.e. senior in age to be ranked No.1). Rest of the candidates from both the Colleges are accorded the seniority based on their relative percentage of total marks (If the candidates from different colleges ranked at same position, the rank will be decided by his/her date of birth, i.e., senior in age to be ranked.)

For Example:-

1. If, the Topper from College 1 gets 800 as his Absolute Total Marks, Candidate A from College 1 gets 500 as his Absolute Total Marks,

2. Topper from College 2 gets 600 as his Absolute Total Marks, Candidate B from College 2 gets 500 as his Absolute Total Marks,

Then, the relative percentage marks will be calculated as follows.-

$$\text{Relative percentage Marks of A} = \frac{\text{Absolute marks of the Candidate A from College 1}}{\text{Absolute marks of the Topper of the College 1}} \times 100$$

Relative percentage Marks of Candidate A = $(500/800) \times 100 = 62.50\%$ (meaning that candidate. A has scored 62.50% compared to the topper from his college).

Similarly, Relative percentage Marks of Candidate B = $(500/600) \times 100 = 83.33\%$

Hence, Candidate B (83.33%) of College 2 will be ranked higher than Candidate A (62.50%) of College 1, though their absolute individual marks are same".
